

Frequently Asked Questions

Mission: To empower homeless expectant mothers by providing tools to build a life that is self-sufficient, sustainable, and has purpose.



- ❖ Are you a shelter? No. DOH Is a transitional housing program, which provides structured services.
- Will you find me an apartment to move into after completing the program? We do not guarantee housing. However, we do provide guidance in the process of searching for secure and stable housing.
- ❖ **Do I need to work and save money while living at DOH?** Yes. Creating a personal budget is one of the first steps. Then a realistic, agreed upon amount, based on your goals, is determined by the program Case Manager.
- ❖ Do I have to pay to be in the program? No. All services are free. If you qualify for government assistance, that will be used for your food.
- ♦ How long can I stay in the program? Up to 18 months. Based upon compliance & goal completion.
- Will I have my own bedroom? Yes, other rooms in the home like the kitchen, living room, and bathrooms are shared spaces. Our moms are not allowed in each other's bedrooms.
- **!s there a curfew?** Yes. 9PM daily.
- Are baby items (diapers, wipes, formula, etc.) provided to me? Basic mom & baby necessities are earned through educational opportunities in our Earn While You Learn Program.
- Will I have help with transportation? Yes. We have a program vehicle that can be used to get you to needed appointments. Bus passes are available at the discretion of DOH staff. If you have a vehicle, you can bring it to the program.
- Can I have visitors at the house while in the program? Visitors are not allowed in the home at any time in order to uphold the safety and privacy of other moms in the program.
- Will I be able to leave the house overnight? No. Our program often has a wait-list and we expect beds to be filled at night.
